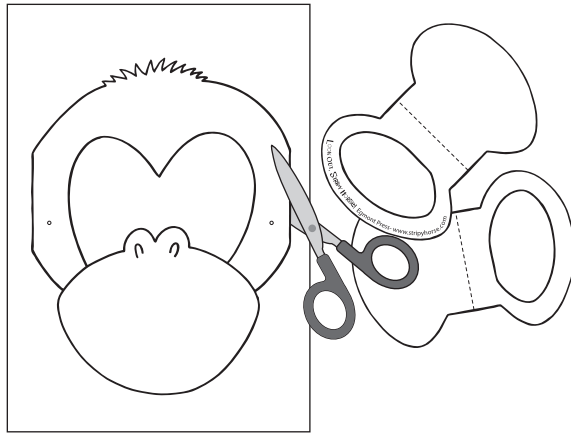
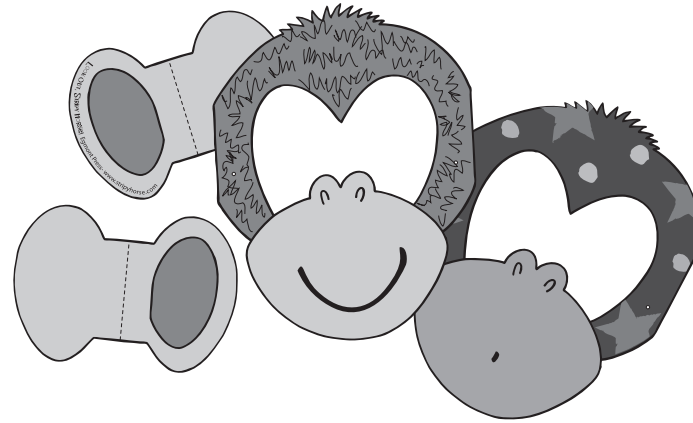


MAKING YOUR MONKEY MASK



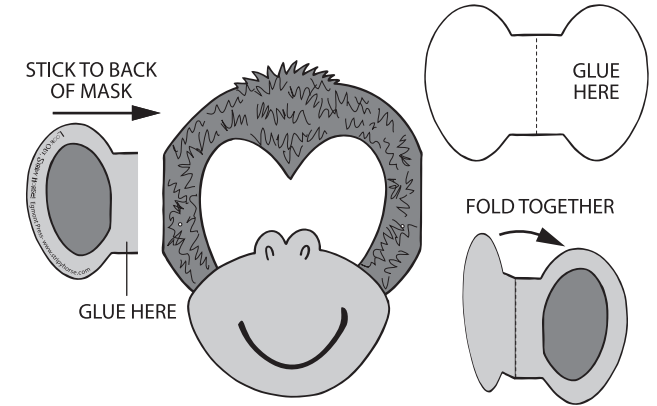
Print out the mask template and stick it to a piece of A4 card. Carefully cut around the outside of the black line.

Do the same for the ears, taking care not to cut along the dotted lines.

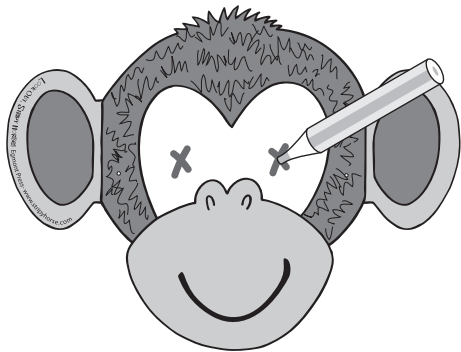


Decorate your mask and ears using paints, felt tips, pencils or crayons. Try sticking on pieces of magazine, fabric or foil to make your design look even more colourful. Remember to give your monkey a mouth!

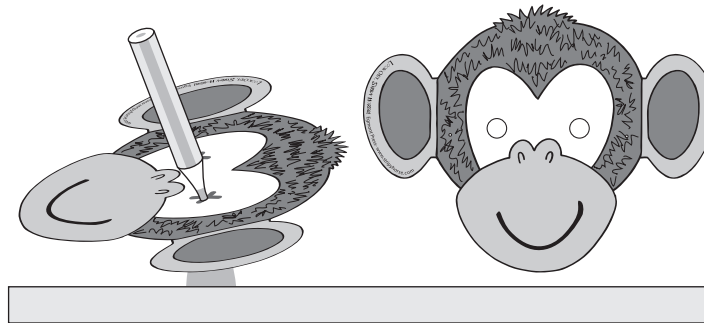
When your mask is finished, leave to dry.



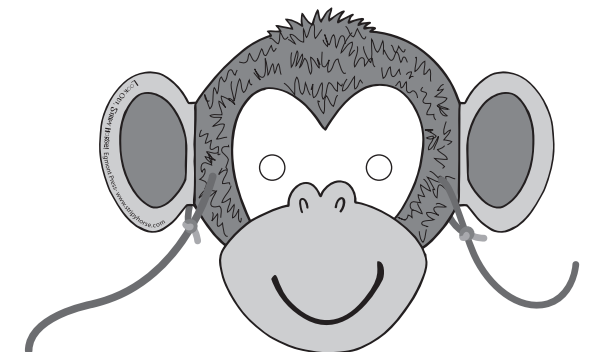
To make ears, fold along the dotted line. Spread glue on the reverse side then fold along crease, pressing both sides firmly together. Once dry, spread a little glue along the front of each ear (near the folded edge) and stick to the back of the mask.



Hold the mask against your face and ask a grown up to mark the mask to show where your eyes are.



Take off the mask and carefully place it on the table. Put an eraser or a blob of Plasticine onto the table, behind where the eye holes will be. Ask a grown up to place the pencil tip on one of the eye marks, making sure that the eraser/Plasticine is directly behind. Push the pencil straight through the mask to make a hole, then repeat for the other eye.



Pierce smaller holes in either side of the mask, thread with string or ribbon and secure with a knot as shown.

Put on your mask for some monkey mayhem!
