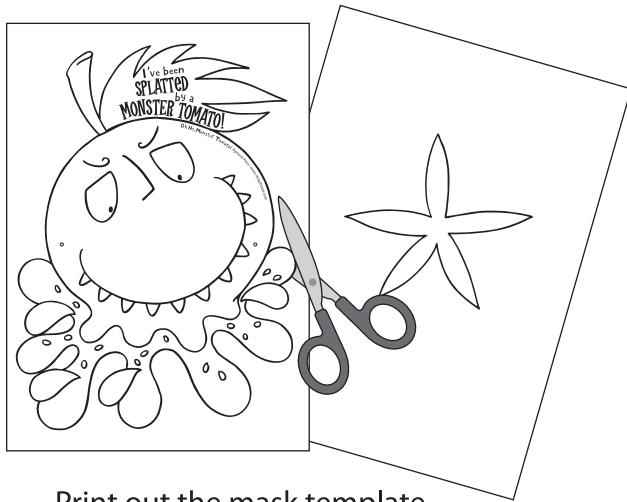
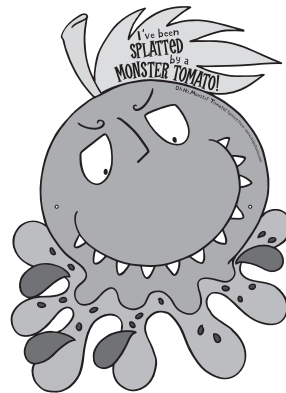


MAKING YOUR MONSTER TOMATO MASK!



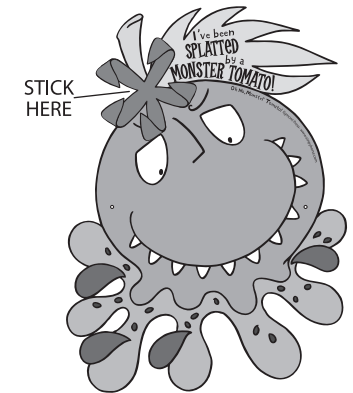
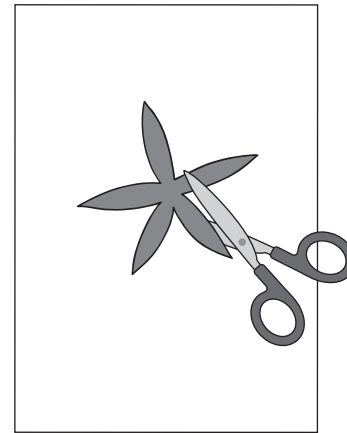
Print out the mask template and stick it to a piece of A4 card. Carefully cut around the outside of the black line.

Leave the star-shaped tomato top on the paper- don't stick to card or cut out.

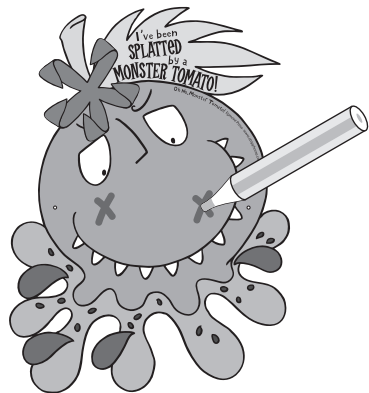


Decorate your mask using paints, felt tips, pencils, crayons or glitter. Colour the tomato top too. Leave the tomato top and mask to dry.

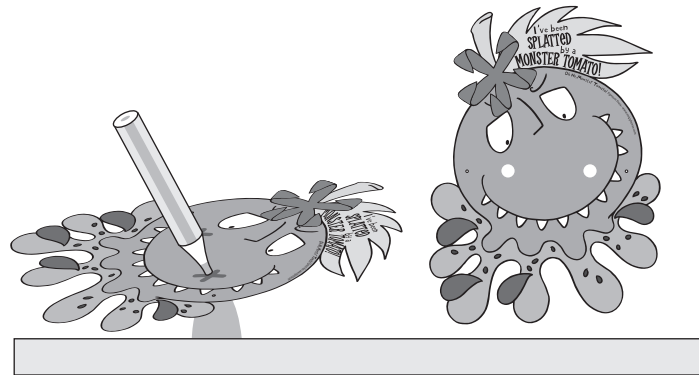
When dry, carefully cut out the tomato top.



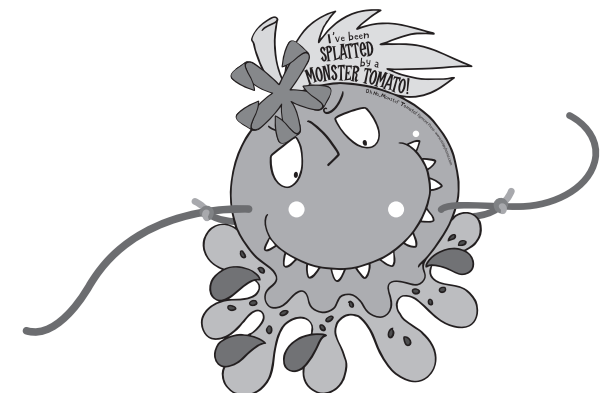
Curl the edges of the tomato top by rolling the tips around a pencil. Put a spot of glue in the middle of the reverse side of the tomato top, then stick to the front of the mask, so that the edges curl up.



Hold the mask against your face and ask a grown up to mark the mask to show where your eyes are.



Take off the mask and carefully place it on the table. Put an eraser or a blob of Plasticine onto the table, behind where the eye holes will be. Ask a grown up to place the pencil tip on one of the eye marks, making sure that the eraser/Plasticine is directly behind. Push the pencil straight through the mask to make a hole, then repeat for the other eye.



Pierce smaller holes in either side of the mask, thread with string or ribbon and secure with a knot as shown. Put on your mask. You look just like you've been splatted by a monster tomato!
